

Acute and Recovered Function Patients in CROWNWeb

- CROWNWeb should only contain chronic ESRD patients, not acute.
- Status is determined by the treating nephrologist when he/she signs the attestation on the CMS-2728 Form that in their medical judgment the patient is now end stage.

Chronic ESRD Patients	Acute Patients
DO enter into CROWNWeb	DO NOT enter into CROWNWeb
CMS 2728-2746 required	CMS 2728/2746 NOT required
The nephrologist considers the patient to be chronic ESRD and will sign the 2728 attesting to this*	Nephrologist has determined the patient is Acute. The patient was erroneously admitted into CROWNWeb.
Patient can "Recover Function" as the discharge reason	Must follow the steps below to remove the patient from CROWNWeb

Removing Acute Patients from CROWNWeb	
If the patient:	Follow these steps:
 Has no submitted 2728 form Has no clinical data Was not admitted to other units 	 Search for the patient in CROWNWeb Click on CROWN UPI Number Select "Edit Patient" from the Patient Attributes Click on the Delete button. This will delete the patient PERMANENTLY from CROWNWeb.
Has no 2728 form BUTHas admission records to more than one unit	Contact the Network to perform the deletion
 Has no 2728 form BUT Has submitted clinical data and/or Has a submitted 2746: 	Discharge the patient using the discharge reason ACUTE 1. Edit Admit/Discharge Record 2. Make sure admit reason is New ESRD Patient 3. Change discharge reason to ACUTE
Has a 2728 form submitted:	Discharge the patient using the discharge reason ACUTE CMS will NOT allow deletion of a 2728 form for an acute patient unless the patient returns to dialysis and the second New ESRD admission is present in CROWNWeb.

^{*}If the nephrologist initially thought the patient was chronic but determined later the patient was Acute, they can change this status if the 2728 has not been submitted. Follow the steps above to remove the patient from CROWNWeb.
